GUIDELINES FOR PSYCHOLOGY FAIR PROJECTS

- 1. Projects must be in the form of a portfolio, poster, digital portfolio or digital research presentation, website, web portfolio, or research poster format.
- 2. All project submissions should be related to psychology and any related psychology fair theme.
- 3. Projects should be neatly organized and formally presented for judging.
- 4. Projects should be clearly identified with the name(s) of the submitter(s) and the title and type of project.
- 5. Poster projects should be professional in appearance and easy to follow. You should use the standard size free standing foam display or exhibit boards that can be purchased from office supply stores according to the guidelines set forth in the guidelines for poster presentations that can be downloaded from www.psyking.net. Go to the Psychology Fair web page to download all guidelines for projects and posters.
- 6. Please make sure that all pictures, diagrams, drawings, graphs and text are securely fastened to the board. For your heading, use anywhere between 48 to 72-point font. As for the text, please use at least a font size of 22 or higher. *Please make sure you do not plagiarize and that you cite all sources used in your presentation.*
- 7. Applications must be submitted no later than Monday, **December 5, 2016** by **7:00** pm to Dr. King's office at LR 307 or to LR 275. You can also submit via e-mail.
- 8. If you miss the submission timelines, all projects must be submitted to the Waddell lobby on Wednesday, December 7, 2016 between 8:00 am and 10:00 am on the day of the fair.
- 9. Psychology Fair winners will be announced by Wednesday of the following week. Please try to be in attendance to receive your certificates and award.
